

1. I participated in the Practical virtualisation workshop. In the workshop, We covered a wide range of technology concepts covering a wide variety of technologies, and practicing in a real-world environment allowed me to learn and retain more. It was very effective for the participants and our teachers first gave us the basic concepts and then explained the topic in-depth and demonstrated it in a real environment. I learned a lot about how to effectively manage costs on AWS, apply it to my organization, and be able to save budget and use resources efficiently.
